Odisha records 64% growth rate in GST Collection during November'21

- 1) GST collection of Odisha has touched new heights with a collection of Rs 4136 Cr during November '21 as against Rs 2528 Cr. collected during November '20 registering a growth of **64%**. The growth of collection during November '21 is also the highest amongst major states for the 3rd consecutive month as well as the highest ever gross collection of GST by the state since launch of GST.
- 2) The progressive GST collection till November '21 is Rs. 28032.98 Cr. against Rs. 17229.26 Cr till November '20 with growth of **62.71 %**. The corresponding collection till November '19 was Rs. 19366.95 Cr.
- 3) The collection of OGST during the month of November '21 is Rs. 1157.69 Cr against a collection of Rs. 681.96 Cr. during November '20 recording a robust growth of **69.76%**. The collection of Rs. 1157.69 Cr during November '21 is also the highest ever gross collection of OGST by the state since the inception of GST.
- 4) The progressive collection of OGST upto November '21 is Rs. 7977.60 Cr. against a collection of Rs. 5013.50 Cr upto November '20 recording a progressive growth of **59.12 %**. The corresponding figure till November '19 was Rs. 5661.18 Cr.
- 5) There is also collection of Rs. 1001.08 Cr. in CGST, Rs. 1223.24 in IGST & 753.77 Cr. in Cess during November '21 recording a growth of 87.62%, 55.31% & 43.62 % over November '20 respectively.
- 6) The total collection of VAT (Petrol & Liquor) is Rs. 844.45 Cr. during November '21 as against Rs.601.65 Cr during November '20 with growth rate of 40.36 %.
- 7) Out of the above, collection from Petroleum Products is Rs. 675.93 Cr. during November '21 as against Rs. 520.56 Cr during November 20 with growth rate of 29.85%. Similarly, collection from Liquor is Rs. 168.52 Cr. during November '21 as against Rs. 81.09 Cr during November 20 with growth rate of 107.82%
- 8) This growth during November'21 is a result of increase in collection from automobile, mining and manufacturing sector. Further, non filer management and regular return scrutiny by Circles combined with enforcement activities has resulted in better compliance by taxpayers. In this regard, during the current FY, 8512 nos. of assessment have been initiated against defaulters for non filing of returns.
- 9) The total e-waybill generated during November '21 was 14.65 Lakh against 13.40 Lakh during November '20 witnessing a growth of 9.38%.
- 10) CT & GST Organization is conducting a special drive for "survey and registration" of all potential GST & Profession Tax Payers throughout the State from November 1st to December 31st. All GST Taxpayers irrespective of their jurisdiction are advised to enroll themselves under Profession Tax Act and pay tax accordingly. 31090 numbers of new registrants have been brought under the GST network during the current FY.
- 11) Zonal review of all Territorial Circles and Ranges including Enforcement Ranges was held during November at five locations in the State i.e. Cuttack, Bhubaneswar, Jharsuguda, Ganjam and Balasore.
- 12) During the course of review, Commissioner of CT & GST, Sri. Sushil Kumar Lohani, IAS instructed the field officers for proper maintenance of records, correct procedure to be followed during return scrutiny, demand and recovery. He also advised the officers to adhere to the principles of 5T and attend to the genuine grievances of the taxpayers without fail.
